3. Which outcome will you assess this year (2016-2017)?

Increase enrollment and graduation of teachers serving 2nd language learners.

Increase enrollment and graduation of teachers in high poverty schools.

In an effort to focus on an increasingly growing language-diverse PK-12 learner population, and growing rate of poverty affecting young learners in our region, we will target practicing teachers working in area schools with a large second-language learners. In addition, we will focus on graduates working in high poverty schools in the Green Bay Area District. This may require additional flexibility on the Universities' part, but we are confident that this program assessment focus will be well worth the effort.

4. Which technique will you use to assess this outcome?

We will look at increasing the number of admissions and graduates from area schools that serve these at-risk populations. We will look at the fall and spring semesters in regards to admission and graduation data. This outcome dovetails with efforts to increase and serve in the area of Diversity.

5. Which course or group of students will you assess on the outcome chosen above and when?

We will look at our compiled data by June 1, 2017. Our program goal will be to have the majority of our graduates in this timeframe serve 2nd language learners or teach in high poverty schools in our community.
