- V. New Business
  - a) Guest Speaker Cofrin Center for Biodiversity
    - Bob Howe: What is the Cofrin Center for Biodiversity? Originated when MAC Hall was built as a gift from the Cofrin Association. Responsibility of overseeing the two museums on campus. 5 natural areas that they manage, including the arboretum. Students are involved for research and internships involving the natural areas. Dr. Howe is a faculty member that is appointed to the Cofrin Center for Biodiversity



- Faculty and Staff Advisory Committee meets every month to discuss issues, proud that students are speaking up about concerns. Maybe appoint a liaison to the Biodiversity Center?
- The objective is to preserve nature and offer education. Obligation to take care of the natural areas, both on and off campus. Mandated off-campus, but a little different on campus due to recreation and land ownership
- Campus Planning Committee Dr. Howe serves as a sustainability liaison. Talk about plans for whole university, like new buildings. This is where the signage initiative came up. Big sign that goes along Highway 54/57. Visibility of campus was brought up, but just a comment. Not completely compatible with arboretum plans. Up Circle Dr. to Bay Settlement, off to the right near pond and open fields this was an area that was wanted to be kept open. Used to be abandoned farmland. We will never cut woods along Bayshore.
- Open areas have grown into shrubby habitats, which was initially good, but now they have disappeared because of the changes in habitat.
- If there is any place where there are changes to how the campus is viewed, it would be there.
- We planted trees along that opening to block noise and traffic from the highway. These are the trees that \*might\* be cut, if anything. It is all conversation as of right now, but Dr. Howe doesn't know how far that conversation has gone, because the signage is all administrative.
- Debatable to whether or not the trees right along the highway are part of the arboretum.
- Faculty / Staff Advisory committee decided this would be a process want to solicit input from everyone in order to come to consensus. This isn't happening anytime soon, process is just starting not even a formal proposal yet.



- Bobby: Thank you for inviting us to have dialogue, we appreciate being able to come in and talk about the issue. Don't know how valuable it would be to cut down trees by HWY 54/57
- Q&A
  - 1. Grace: Could we get a map up to look at the grounds of GB, to reference where we are talking about?
    - a. Dr. Howe pulled up Google Maps and showed us where the arboretum is, and where the sign would go
  - 2. Sara: Do you think the Biodiversity Center will be included in this conversation in the future?
    - a. They meet regularly with Paul Pinkston, so there is some communication.
  - 3. Abbie: Any decisions would be run through the Biodiversity Center?
    - a. Any decisions about the arboretum would be run through Dr. Howe
  - 4. Montana: Where on the map is the pond referenced?
  - 5. Will: Would they be cutting down a large portion of trees, if they did?
    - a. Hasn't really been talked about, but if it was, it would be minimal. The area right near Bay Settlement and HWY 54/57 is not mature trees. They were just planted there manually within the last decade. Used to all be savannah, open grassland, barely any trees.
  - 6. Sara: Would this affect noise pollution if we cleared some out? Would we get a lot of highway noise?
    - a. If we decided as a campus to cut some evergreen trees off of Hwy 54/57, we might get a good portion of highway noise

  - 8. Grace: Does facilities have any jurisdiction over the arboretum?
    - a. There is no statutory "authority". Technically owned by the Board of Regents, so they have final say. However, we would fight it valiantly

  - a. No, given to us by the City of GB, but the Cofrin family gives us the money to manage the arboretum
- 10. Sara: Is there any other student voices about this issue?
